

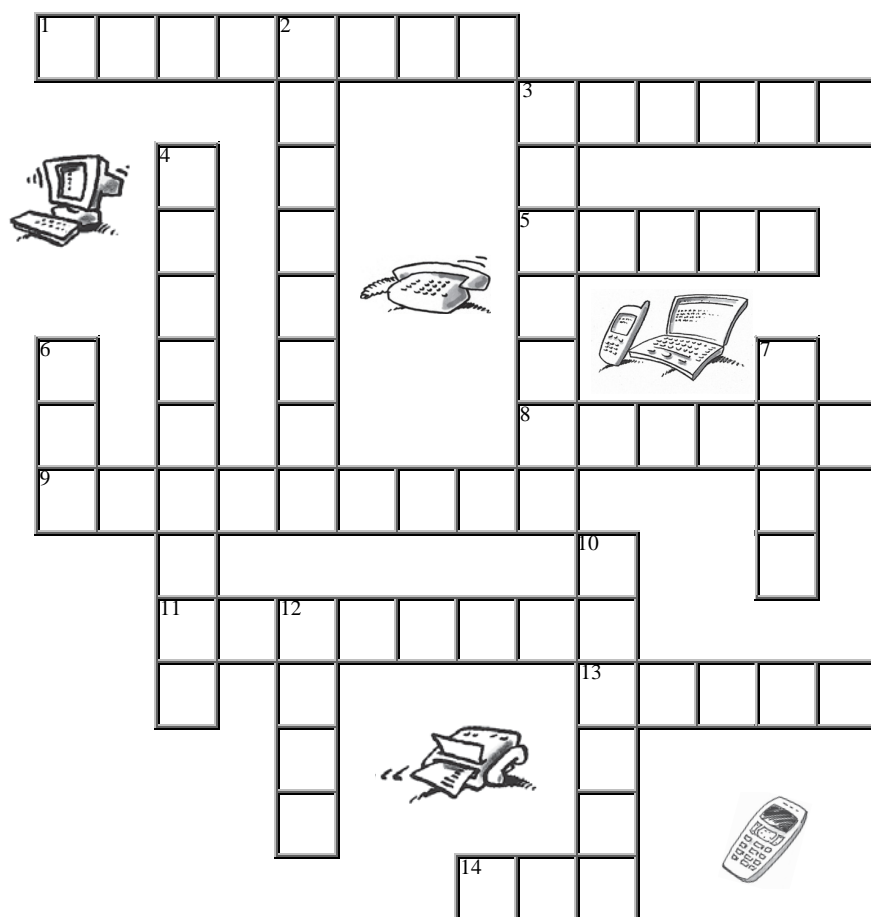


## Alexander Graham Bell

Alexander Graham Bell, the inventor of the telephone, was born in Edinburgh, Scotland, on 3 March 1847. Later he moved to Ontario, Canada, and then to Boston in the United States. In 1876 he invented the telephone, an “electrical speech machine” as he called it.
